PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Last week we were able to distribute devices to all children who had indicated they required one to be able to access work from home. The next week or so will be an opportunity to complete the work packs already sent home and to begin to engage in some online learning through Google Classroom. As with any change there will be hiccups and challenges hopefully these will be addressed and we can work together to continue to do the best we can in these circumstances. For families without access to the internet we are working on a plan that will involve more hard copy work similar to what we have sent home already. We understand that taking a device home is novel and exciting and I urge parents to monitor the use of the device as a vehicle for learning.

In conversations and other communication with parents over the last week or so, most apprehension comes from the feeling that children have to be working the full school day. The government guidelines for remote education explains how many hours a day parents should be expecting their child to engage in learning from home. In total it really amounts to about 2 - 2.5 hours per day maximum. Remote learning has meant that there is more idleness in our days, particularly the students. During a typical school day, students are moving around the class regularly; they are not expected to sit in their seats for extended periods of time. They also engage in 80 minutes of outside play during each day. As we move toward the colder months this is particularly important now as we may be inside a lot later in the term.

As students learn from home, please factor in short but regular breaks that require your child/ children to get up and move; every 20 minutes or so is ideal. Please also ensure outside time is part of their day, if possible. Striking a balance between passive school work and activity will support the academic and physical needs of your child/children.

Parents too, need a break. Please do not feel you need to assume five full hours of rigorous learning time for your child/children to be successful each day. Some days you will achieve a lot and other days you will not, and that is ok. Please also make sure your child's/children's learning works with the demands of your days. Allowing your child/children to start their learning early, late, or sometimes not at all is ok.

Adding the responsibility of supporting your child's/children's learning to your already busy days is a complex and challenging task. Given that the remote learning model is in place for some time, developing a sustainable action plan for home is essential.

DONGLES & SIM CARDS

I have spoken with representatives of Catholic Education Sandhurst about accessing the "government promised dongles and SIM cards". It appears that Telstra and the government severely underestimated the demand for these products from Victorian schools. No timelines have been issued for the arrival of either the dongles or SIM cards, we wait with baited breath.

After having to postpone the Easter raffle we are now in the position to draw the prizes today. Thanks to Miss Gillett, Miss O'Sullivan and Mrs Carter who have undertaken the task of organising prizes (5), ticket scrunching and money collation. For families who were unable to return tickets because of the sudden shutdown at the end of Term 1, we look forward to returning to normality next year! Thanks also to the Parents & Friends for their organisation of our annual event. Like everything at the moment, it didn't go to plan, however your flexibility and support are again important to our school efforts.



REPORTING



At this stage we are unable to advise on any changes to reporting requirements until Federal and State governments advise all three educational sectors as to any changes in the usual compliance practices and requirements. As soon as advice is received from our governments, our parents will be alerted of the changes in compliance requirements. We will not be having Learning Conversations as staff maintain a high degree of contact with families and Journals will also be not sent out as we continue down the online learning path.

The process for enrolling new Foundation students for 2021 begins this Term. As always, we look forward with great excitement, to welcoming new members into the Holy Rosary community. A reminder to current parents that if you have a child/sibling who will be starting Foundation in 2021 to please complete an enrolment and return it to the office as soon as possible. Hopefully we will be able to have an information night and tours next Term. GOSPEL REFLECTION - THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER



In Sunday's Gospel, despondent and discouraged, two of Jesus' apostles walked from Jerusalem to Emmaus. They talked on their way about the events that had occurred in the past several days. A stranger joined them, it was actually Jesus, but they didn't recognize him at first. Jesus asked the apostles what they had been discussing and they responded with a summary of the events surrounding Jesus' death. The disciples still did not understand the resurrection, but Jesus questioned their resistance to believe what the prophets had foretold. Despite their hopelessness the apostles invited Jesus to stay with them. He accepted. It was that evening, when Jesus broke bread with them, that the disciples finally recognized the stranger to be Jesus. The next morning, the disciples returned to Jerusalem.

REFLECTION FOR FAMILIES:

To travel from Jerusalem to Emmaus, the disciples had to go west. But after their encounter with Jesus, they returned to Jerusalem, an eastward Journey. We often equate endings with sunsets and new beginnings with sunrises. It is helpful to recall that on the next morning, the apostles walked toward the rising sun. How many sunsets find us falling into bed collapsed from exhaustion? Isn't it true that after a good night's rest we meet the sunrise with new energy and hope? This Gospel gives us the courage to start again, each new day, with fresh enthusiasm and energy for ourselves, our families, and our God.


HAPPY BIRTHDAY




HANDS ON MATHS
