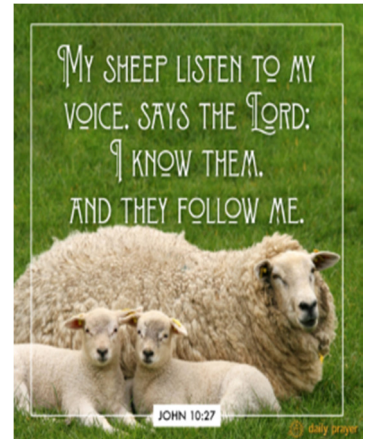

HEAD LICE



We have reports of Head Lice in some classrooms. Many head lice do not cause an itch, so you have to look carefully to find them. We ask all parents to please check their children's hair regularly, especially at change of seasons and treat if necessary. Once hair has been treated, children can be returned to school. Anyone can get head lice and given the chance head lice move from head to head without discrimination (washed or unwashed hair, it does not matter). Children get head lice from direct hair to hair contact with another person who has head lice. This can happen when children play, cuddle or are working close together. They do not have wings or jumping legs so they cannot fly or jump from head to head. They can only crawl.

CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS



Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy, learning and socialising. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level.

If you have any questions you can contact Peta Mazurak, Ed. Speech Pathologist through the School's Special Education Coordinator, Mandy Antoniadis. Good luck and most importantly enjoy this very special time with your child.

10. Pragmatics and Social skills - Focus: Identifying strengths and skills in others, acknowledging and giving praise.

Go through your child's school photo ask them to name each child and say something positive about each child. It could be about their hobbies, personality, looks, family or something they've done.

With your child write 10 different ways of praising someone on a poster or a set of cards.

For example: Hey that was great! I really liked the way you.... You're really good at that! Good job, well done, super mate etc Practise saying these phrases so they are genuine and discuss when you might use them at home and at school.

Ask your child to use a different form of praise from the poster to a different person everyday. When they get home from school ask them to report on their use of praise and what sort of response they got from the other person.

Don't forget to reward them daily (verbally) or at the end of each week (with a favourite activity) for regularly praising and considering others feelings.

A typical canteen volunteer can expect the following tasks when they come in:

ORDERING DAY (usually Thurs 9 - 11am) (toddlers welcome)

- checking paper bag orders and counting money
- reading out orders to be tallied by Lindy
- putting sauces, forks & serviettes in bags
- putting bags in class groups
- writing pastry orders/wraps/sandwiches on bags

PREPARATION/COOKING/BAGGING DAY (usually Friday morning 9am - 12pm)

- making sandwiches and wraps, coleslaw, fruit cups
 - putting nuggets onto trays
 - putting pastries in bags
 - bagging biscuits
 - bagging popcorn
 - dishes
 - bagging orders once all food is ready (11am)
 - handing class tubs to students (you often get to see your child at this time)
- All tasks are directed by Lindy.

WINDOW SALES (usually Friday 1:30-2:30) (toddlers welcome)

- serving children at canteen window (chance to see your child at this time)
 - easy amounts (all prices are either 0.50c or \$1)
 - lines are monitored by yard duty teacher
 - putting away dishes
- All tasks directed by Lindy.


This initiative is funded by the Australian Government Department of Social Services through the Helping Children with Autism package.
