PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Firstly, I would like to thank Mrs Teed and a team of teachers and helpers who put together the Grade 3-6 performance. It was great to see the smiles on faces, the joy in performance and fun that was so obvious in their participation. Well done to all!

Thanks also to the P&F for the organisation of the Trivia night, it was a great social night and a wonderful opportunity to connect with our community.

In Sunday's Gospel, parents better than most people, know what it means to "serve" without expecting a reward. For many, parenthood is reward enough. Jesus explained to the disciples in this passage that service was a requirement of discipleship. When the disciples asked how they could have more faith, Jesus explained that faith was a gift. Faith is not something we control, but only something we can appreciate as a gift from God. To show our appreciation however, Jesus demonstrated through a lesson of service how we can show our thankfulness to God for the gift of faith. When we share our faith with others and demonstrate it by showing the love of God to those we meet, we proclaim our gratitude.

Parents often fall into bed at night declaring to the empty darkness, "No one appreciates all I did today." Perhaps it's that a lot of parents spend most of their years in a state of exhaustion, but when those little legs climb up to our laps and tiny hands clutch our necks in a hug, we don't feel quite so weary or burdened. The smile that crosses our lips shows our true appreciation for God's gift and the service we offer is our gift in return.

Mrs Matheson will soon be taking leave as she prepares for the birth of their first child. Her final day before beginning maternity leave is Friday November 22nd. Megan will be replaced by Liz Williams who is currently a teacher at Holy Rosary. CHILDREN'S CHATTER MATTERS



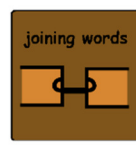
Ten activities will be provided each term focusing on key areas of oral language supporting literacy, learning and socialising. Feel free to adjust these activities according to your child's grade level.

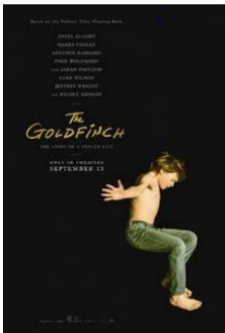

Protect your children online

Protect your children

The use of mobile telephones, tablets and personal computers is common in most people's lives.

Children are encouraged to use these devices to assist with their studies and stay connected, but this technology can also be used by online predators to target children.

A lot of children use mobile devices to keep in contact with friends via social media. Whilst using these sites, there is a chance they could come into contact with online predators.

Here are some simple steps we all can take to help protect our children when they are online.

Children - protect yourself online

- **NEVER** post personal information, including your name, home address, photograph, phone number or school, anywhere on the internet.
- **ALWAYS** tell your parents or another adult you know of any contact online that makes you feel uncomfortable.
- **NEVER** arrange a face-to-face meeting with someone you have chatted to online without your parents' or carers' full knowledge. Have a parent/carer accompany you.
- **ALWAYS** think before sending. Pressing 'send' is definite and final – you can't get it back.
- **DO NOT** send a picture of yourself to anyone you don't know.

Parents - protect your children online

- **ALWAYS** educate your children about the dangers associated with online conversations.
- **ENSURE** that you discuss age-appropriate sites with your children.
- **TALK** to your child about what they do online and their favourite sites to visit.
- **CHECK** with your child's school, public library, and other places they frequent to find out what internet sites they're accessing.
- **ALWAYS** monitor the status of safety settings on devices used by your child.

Protect your home devices

- **DEACTIVATE** settings like GPS from social media sites used by your child.
- **ENSURE** you and your family use strong passwords to secure your devices.
- **ALWAYS** use secure web browsers and active parental control restrictions on your home computer and devices.
- **PROTECT** your passwords so your child cannot automatically purchase apps without your approval.
- **DO NOT GIVE YOUR PASSWORD TO ANYONE - NO ONE!**
