## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

This week we celebrate Ash Wednesday, the first day of one of the most important seasons in the Church's liturgical year - Lent.

Lent is a time when we try to get closer to God. The children are encouraged to think of things they could do to achieve this e.g. have conversations with God, do good deeds and give to Project Compassion. As adults we understand these acts to be FASTING, PRAYER and ALMSGIVING.

**FASTING:** Fasting is an ancient action linked to Lent and is considered a sacred act. The goal of fasting is connected to prayer. The pangs of hunger remind us of our hunger for God and prayer and fasting brings us to what Lent is about – a deeper conversion and relationship with God.

**PRAYER:** Fasting and almsgiving are merely actions we do out of tradition, if not connected to prayer. Prayer is our conversation with God. In these conversations we find the strength to fast, to develop a closer and more intimate relationship with God. This relationship makes us grateful for our many blessings and motivates us to give to those less fortunate.

**ALMSGIVING:** This is simply a response by us to God, a response that we have come to through prayer and fasting. It expresses our gratitude for all we have been given. We come to a realisation that we all make up the Body of Christ and with this realisation there is a responsibility. That responsibility is to all who are part of the Body of Christ. This means that our acts of charity and the promotion of justice are integral elements of the Christian way of life.

### SHROVE TUESDAY

Tomorrow as we prepare for Ash Wednesday, the children will have the opportunity to share pancakes in each class. A big thank you to the Parents and Friends for providing the ingredients and to Mrs Carter and Mrs Teed and the student leadership group who will cook the pancakes. It is always a fun day.

We will also have our choir performing in the Mall as Caritas launch the 2020 Project Compassion program. I look forward to joining them for their performance.

### CATHOLIC SWIMMING

Congratulations to all students who represented Holy Rosary in the Catholic Swimming Carnival last week. Our 11 year old girls relay team **BROKE THE RECORD** while placing 1st for their race. The last time this record was broken was in 2013! A big pat on the back to Zoe and Charlie who were awarded Best Contributor Medals. 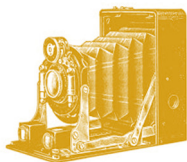
## SCHOOL NEWS

## SHROVE TUESDAY PANCAKES:

All students at Holy Rosary will have the opportunity to eat pancakes at school on Tuesday. If you do not want your child to participate in this festivity for reasons other than allergies or diet e.g. 'no sugar diet' you must inform the classroom teacher of your request to ensure your child does not get a pancake.

## ASH WEDNESDAY MASS - WEDNESDAY 25TH MARCH

Ash Wednesday is a Holy Day of Obligation, FAST and ABSTINENCE. Students will be attending Mass at 9.15am on Ash Wednesday. Please refrain from placing meat products in your child's lunch boxes on this day. While lent abstinences is now optional on Fridays, it is good practice to keep up if possible. It also reminds students of the bigger picture that leads into Good Friday.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE - CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)

The Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) is a Victorian Government program that assists eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities. Any parents/carers who hold a valid means-tested concession card, a Gold DVA card or are a temporary foster parent, may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards these items. If you did not receive a CSEF payment in 2019, have had a new child start, or are a new family please see the office for information and an application form. If you are unsure whether you are eligible, whether you need to reapply etc, please see Paula in the Office.

## FOODSHARE PANTRY

Bendigo Foodshare collects food that would otherwise go to waste and distributes it through community organisations and schools throughout Central Victoria. This year Bendigo Foodshare has rescued over 586,000 kgs of food.

Holy Rosary gets deliveries of food each week to help support our families and the wider community. The Foodshare pantry in the front foyer will be restocked weekly with items for families to take home. Students need an adult with them to take things from the pantry. Depending on what we get, we may also send items home with students.

Our pantry is there to support everyone; whether you forgot to go to the supermarket or you know someone who could use the extra hand, please feel free to use the pantry.

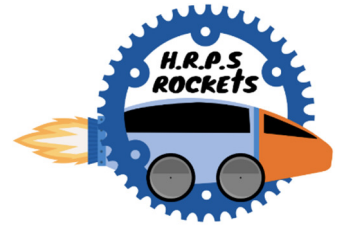
### ENERGY BREAKTHROUGH FUNDRAISING

## CANTEEN VOLUNTEERS

Have you been thinking about volunteering in our school Canteen but not sure that you have what it takes? Good news! You don't need any special culinary skills; just a friendly can-do attitude and a Working with Children Check!

A typical canteen volunteer can expect the following tasks when they come in:

### **ORDERING DAY (usually Thurs 9 - 11am) (toddlers welcome)**

- checking paper bag orders and counting money
- reading out orders to be tallied by Lindy
- putting sauces, forks & serviettes in bags
- putting bags in class groups
- writing pastry orders/wraps/sandwiches on bags

### **PREPARATION/COOKING/BAGGING DAY (usually Friday morning 9am - 12pm)**

- making sandwiches and wraps, coleslaw, fruit cups
- putting nuggets onto trays
- putting pastries in bags
- bagging biscuits
- bagging popcorn
- dishes
- bagging orders once all food is ready (11am)
- handing class tubs to students (you often get to see your child at this time)

All tasks are directed by Lindy.

### **WINDOW SALES (usually Friday 1:30-2:30) (toddlers welcome)**

- serving children at canteen window (chance to see your child at this time)
  - easy amounts (all prices are either 0.50c or \$1)
  - lines are monitored by yard duty teacher
  - putting away dishes
- All tasks directed by Lindy.

Please note, that volunteers in our canteen DO need to have a current WWC Check, but DO NOT need to hold a Food Handling Certificate. If you are able to volunteer in our Canteen this term, please contact Lindy Vance or the school office.
