PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The weekend saw the culmination of a wonderful period of preparation and commitment as 22 children received the sacrament of confirmation. The connection with the beginning of the church year on Pentecost Sunday ensured the day was a special day in the faith lives of the children and their families. It was fantastic to have Bishop Shane confer the sacrament for the first time in our Parish, we thank him for his warmth and care which made for a memorable day for all.

A huge thank you to Mrs Thurley for her coordination and organisation, staff who filled many roles in the day and along the journey and especially to Fr Minh, who in his short time in the Parish has worked hard with us all to build an important link to the Parish.

Today we celebrate 200 years since the first Catholic School commenced in Australia. In 2021 Catholic Education communities will come together to celebrate this significant milestone. In the Sandhurst Diocese, we gathered at St Kilian's Church to celebrate the 200 year anniversary of Catholic Education as it was the site of the first Catholic School established in the Diocese. It is amazing to think of the presence our Catholic schools continue to have in our country, in particular own city of Bendigo and more broadly the Diocese.

This Thursday 27th June marks the beginning of National Reconciliation Week, a significant event for Indigenous and Non-Indigenous people of this Nation. The dates for National Reconciliation Week remain the same each year; 27 May to 3 June. These dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively. Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians— as individuals, families, communities, organisations and importantly as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

Much has happened since the early days of the people's movement for reconciliation, including greater acknowledgement of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander rights to land and sea,

understanding of the impact of government policies and frontier conflicts and an embracing of stories of Indigenous success and contribution. In 2020 we also celebrate the twentieth anniversary of the Reconciliation walks of 2000, when people came together to walk across bridges and along roads throughout the nation to show their support for a more reconciled Australia. As always, we stand on the shoulders of those who came before us. Australians now benefit from the efforts and contributions of people committed to reconciliation in the past.

The 2021 National Reconciliation Week theme, *More than a word - Reconciliation takes action*, urges the reconciliation movement towards braver and more impactful action. Each individual has a role to play when it comes to reconciliation, and in playing our part we collectively build relationships and communities that value Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, histories and cultures. At Holy Rosary we acknowledge the DjaDja Wurrung Peoples as the Traditional Custodians of land. We recognise their long history and culture and continue our commitment to the reconciliation process.

National Reconciliation Week (NRW) is a time for all of us to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation. Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all of us as we move forward, creating a community strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. As a school we continue to build connections and develop our understanding of our country's indigenous culture and the need for Reconciliation.

Finally, a reminder that we will are currently enrolling children for Foundation 2022, please return applications for enrolment as soon as possible to ensure we have an accurate picture of the demand for next year.

From now until the end of July 2022, the Society of Jesus will celebrate "The Ignatian Year" to remember the life of St Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits. It is the 500th anniversary of St Ignatius' injury during the Battle of Pamplona on May 20, 1521. While defending the citadel of Pamplona against French forces, St Ignatius was seriously injured after being struck by a cannonball.
