PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The last two years have certainly impacted on the wonderful community input from our parents. At our School Council meeting last week, we discussed the opportunity to reset and restart our Parents and Friends (P&F) Committee, who are able to coordinate social activities and fundraisers for the school. We are inviting interested parents to a special meeting in the Rosarium on Tuesday 5th April at 7pm to discuss the opportunities and reset our calendar.

As per my letter last week, we will be seeing the start of construction of the COLA (covered outdoor learning area) over the tennis courts. The resultant closure of the drive through and access to the court area will be for the remainder of the term and we hope that all works will be complete by Term 2. We anticipate that there will be some road congestion at pick up time in

particular, and ask that families exercise caution and patience during this interruption. The project will be a huge benefit to the community and provide some much-needed undercover space for play and teaching.



It seems COVID is still impacting our school community. We have had a steady absence rate of students isolating since the start of the year. Lately, staff have experienced the same. This seems to be the norm across all industries at the moment and as a result is causing staff shortages. I'd like to alert parents and carers to the fact that there are going to be inconsistencies at school that are beyond our control. We know that with regular staff away this causes anxiety and uneasiness for some students. We are doing our very best to maintain routines in classrooms and at play, but please be mindful of our staff and the challenges they are facing with this.

This week, I will be attending the Victorian Association Catholic Primary School Principals [VACPSP] 2022 Leaders Conference, Hope, For Now and Whatever Lies Ahead. I am looking forward to the many innovative keynote speakers and engaging discussions that will take place during the week. The Conference aims to explore the importance of hope and optimism in education and leadership within our own school communities and throughout Catholic Education Victoria. Jo Thurley and the Leadership Team will keep things at Holy Rosary running very smoothly in my absence.

Like many remote Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities, Janice faces a range of challenges – low employment and education, financial hardship, poorer health and lower life expectancy.

Janice believes that Djilpin Arts' work is essential to create opportunities for young people to stay on-country, to share intergenerational knowledge between elders and the younger generation - to promote healing, and to keep culture alive.

CYBER SAFETY - IS YOUR CHILD GETTING A NEW PHONE/DEVICE?

It may be a new device or you are upgrading your child's device. It is important to reflect on the following safety tips and rules for phone and online usage with your child to help keep them safe when they are online.

Here are some topics to discuss and share with them before the big day:

- Talk to your kids about online privacy issues, ensuring they know never to identify personal information such as their full name, address, phone number, age, school and never post photos in school uniform.
- Make sure the apps you allow your kids to use are age-appropriate. Also, ensure they know how to report and block someone within the app if they are mistreated or feel uncomfortable in anyway and that they speak up and notify you ASAP.
- Discuss online strangers and ensure they know not to accept friend requests or allow anyone to follow them who isn't
 a friend or someone they know in real life (IRL).
- Regularly audit or check their friend lists and ask them how they know the people that follow them.
- Ban devices from the bedroom and bathrooms from as young as possible. Set boundaries around usage and when/where they can use their phones, including not having devices in bedrooms at bedtime.
- Teach your children to respect other people's privacy and not share anyone else's personal information, photos, or videos online without permission or consent.
- For younger kids, monitor and supervise their group chats and conversations. Regularly check their messages and inapp discussions to ensure they aren't being bullied or groomed online, and nothing nefarious happens.
- Please make sure the young people in your care know that they should never go and meet up with anyone they meet online under any circumstances.
- Discuss and set up Screentime restrictions for Apple devices and Digital Wellbeing on Android so that the device does the screen time monitoring for you!
- Have ongoing regular discussions and conversations around online safety and spend time regularly getting to know your child's online activities and what they spend their time doing while online. Maybe play a game or two with them or watch to see what your child is into.

The online world is ever-changing, and the only way we can help our children be safer digital citizens and teach resilience is to educate and empower them through ongoing conversations and learning ourselves.

We don't expect our children and teens to be able to drive and get their license after playing Mario Kart, and we shouldn't expect them to know how to stay safe and navigate potentially dangerous situations online without help either.

ABORIGINAL PERSPECTIVES: NEW FIRE CARRIER STUDENTS INITIATION CEREMONY - FRIDAY 18TH MARCH

Troy has worked with the students from Grades 3 - 6 in Visual Arts sessions and with last year's Fire Carrier students, who completed the art mural at our school. A highlight was Troy playing the didgeridoo while the new Fire Carriers signed their commitment forms. All current Fire Carrier students and staff were also part of the ceremony.

Congratulations to our new Fire Carrier students, Sophie Healy, Xander Baerken, Jack Yates, Charlie Boland, Natalie Hoffrichter, Kayla Bell and Lily McKee who will be learning more about the Aboriginal culture with Troy Firebrace and sharing stories and ideas with the students at our school.

It was an honour to have our new School Message Stick presented to Paul and to our staff and students by Troy Firebrace at the start of the ceremony. The Fire Carrier students of the past worked with Troy to establish designs and colours on the message stick that represent our school with links to Aboriginal culture. The wood is from the Barmah forest near Cummeragunga mission where a "Walk Off " protest occurred in 1939. 


