PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Our first week was certainly a busy one and it was great to see everyone back onsite and enthusiastic in our return to school. Our opening school year mass was a great success, with the year six children and teachers organising the mass for us all. Fr Minh made everyone very welcome and I was extremely proud of the children and their participation in the liturgy.

Sunday's Gospel gives us two powerful images of what it means to follow Jesus. Having recently chosen his first disciples and delivered the sermon on the mount, Jesus uses salt and light to describe what it means to be people of the kingdom. We use the phrase 'salt of the earth' today to describe a decent person, a good human being, but I think that Jesus emphasises the difference a person can make in another's life. Just like salt that flavours and preserves food, we can enhance the lives of others by being people followers of Christ.

PARISH NEWS

LEARNER DIVERSITY: PROGRAM SUPPORT GROUP "PSG" MEETINGS

Welcome back to 2023! The Program Support Group (PSG) Meetings are scheduled meetings that provide collaborative discussions between school, home and external therapeutic support for students with additional needs within our school. These conversations support the set goals and adjustments that are developed, to guide and reinforce the learning that takes place within the school setting.

As we move forward into 2023, careful consideration and thought has been put in place regarding the scheduling of PSG meetings, to ensure they align with the new Enterprise Bargaining Agreement (EBA) for teachers. The EBA will impact on teachers' workloads and your access to teachers outside of school hours. Therefore, PSG meetings will take place each Friday during Term 1; beginning in week 5 through to Week 9. In addition, meetings will now run for 35 minutes to allow parents, teachers and the Learner Diversity Leader to discuss the student's personalised learning plan (PLP) with an emphasis on the student's goals that have been put in place to support the learning for your child. – *Mandy Antoniadis (Learner Diversity Leader)*

BUS PRICE INCREASE

FOUNDATION - GRADE 2 PHYSICAL EDUCATION FOCUS: TERM ONE

All students in F-2 will be participating in a Perceptual Motor Program (PMP). A PMP involves students participating in a variety of carefully selected activities on a regular basis to improve their abilities in motor, perception and skill outcomes. It aims to support students in developing basic motor skills. Other areas of focus throughout the term will be the fundamental motor skills of catching, kicking and running. We will also be looking at developing teamwork and sportsmanship skills.

GRADE 3 - GRADE 6 PHYSICAL EDUCATION FOCUS: TERM ONE

All students in Grade 3 - 6 will be participating in our sport program focusing this term on BlueEarth, T-Ball, Swimming, Badminton and Cross Country. During these lessons they will develop their fundamental motor skills of catching, running, two hand strike, forehand strike. Further to this they will work on their sportsmanship, self-umpiring, regulating emotions and teamwork.

FoodShare is back up and running. Our FoodShare pantry is in the Rosarium with the second-hand uniform store. We are lucky this year to have all our cold, frozen and pantry goods in the same area. FoodShare is delivered on a Tuesday morning.

The day will involve the whole school and comprise of four activity rotations in House groups throughout the day, culminating in a whole school community bush dance on the tennis courts at 2.15pm.



ATTENDANCE UPDATE

At Holy Rosary Primary we are passionate about students attending and participating in their learning on a daily basis. Over the past few years, regular attendance has been difficult with remote learning and illness. It feels like this year we have the opportunity to promote and encourage excellent school attendance at Holy Rosary. Students attend school regularly to learn, socialise with friends and to prepare themselves to take their place in society as well-rounded and responsible citizens. Holy Rosary encourages you to have your child/children attend school on a daily basis. It is important as parents we try to make appointments when possible after school for our children so it is not impacting their time at school, although understanding this is not always possible. Please talk to your classroom teacher if your child will have appointments on a regular basis that may take them out of the classroom. We do encourage all children to stay home if they are unwell or showing signs of illness.

In my role as pastoral care and well-being leader I am here to assist parents, families and students if attendance is becoming difficult or you are finding your child is not wanting to attend school regularly. CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE PROGRAM (CAP) 2023

The Conveyance Allowance is a form of financial assistance from the Victorian State Government to assist families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school. The allowance is available to parents who are required to –

- drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to school (if there is no school bus)
- or drive their child more than 4.8 kilometres to meet the nearest school bus to the school
- the child must attend their closest government or non-government school (Catholic)
- the allowance is based on kilometres travelled and not based on any financial eligibility

Distance is calculated by the shortest practical route from home to the school or from home to meet the nearest school bus to the school. Distance can be calculated by using Bing Maps. Application and Authority to Pay Forms required to be completed by a parent are available from the school office.

Parents who received the Conveyance Allowance in 2022 do not need to complete a new form in 2023 unless their children enrolled at Holy Rosary in 2022 have changed (i.e. Gr 6 student left at the end of 2022 or a Foundation child commenced in 2023). If your family circumstances have changed, a new form needs to be completed in 2023.

If you have recently changed address, please advise the office if you are no longer eligible. Application and Authority to Pay forms need to be completed and returned to the office by Friday 10 March 2023 please.
