PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

It was a wonderful celebration of Confirmation and Eucharist on Saturday night. Having Bishop Shane with us to celebrate the occasion was special for all involved and the children were a credit to their families and the school. The celebration itself was both reflective and meaningful to the Parish, school and families of the children who were anointed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and welcomed at the Table of the Lord for the first time. Celebrating sacraments are very important milestones for our children as they develop a deeper understanding of the importance of Jesus Christ in their lives.

Attending this celebration on Saturday night reminded me of my First Communion and the significance it has had on my life. We continue to pray that our Grade 3 students will always remember receiving the Eucharist for the first time and that they too, will continue to receive the Eucharist to develop a closer relationship with God and understand the importance God plays in their lives. ATTENDANCE

CANTEEN VOLUNTEERS NEEDED


